Service & Pupil Premium – please contact us for the Spring Census 18th January 2018

The Service Family element is to support children and young people with a parent who is, or has been in the regular armed forces in the past four years (known as Ever 4)

Service parents with children in State maintained schools, Free schools and Academies in England are encouraged to ensure that the Head Teacher of their child(ren)'s school is made aware of their Service status for the Spring School Census which will be conducted on 18th January 2018.

- The Service Pupil Premium is provided by the Department for Education, to State maintained schools, Free schools and Academies in England who have children of Regular Armed Forces personnel among their pupil population to provide additional (mainly pastoral) support.
- The Premium is currently £300 per Service pupil and is paid directly to schools. Schools with Service children in Reception to Year 11 classes are eligible to receive the fund, but only if your child(ren)'s name appears on the school's roll as being a Service child.
- The information recorded by schools regarding Service status is protected and the data regarding individual children is not shared outside the school.

Pupil Premium Grant (PPG) was introduced in April 2011 and is allocated to schools for disadvantaged children who are either looked after by Hampshire County Council or to those who have been eligible for Free School Meals (FSM) at any point in the last six years (known as Ever 6 FSM). The purpose of the grant is to raise the attainment of disadvantaged pupils and close the gap between them and their peers.

Parents are encouraged to ensure that the Head Teacher of their child(ren)'s school is made aware of their Pupil Premium status for the Spring School Census which will be conducted on 18th January 2018.

You can check eligibility for pupil premium and free school meals by using the online checking facility:

To complete a check you need the following information for yourself or the person you are checking on behalf of:

- your own name, date of birth, and contact details
- National Insurance number or National Asylum Seekers number
- child's name and date of birth
- school your child is attending or will attend

Application to Sparsholt C of E Primary School (Year R) in September 2018

This is a reminder that the deadline for applying for a place for your child/children to start Year R in September 2018 is **midnight on Monday 15 January 2018**.

You can apply online at www.hants.gov.uk/admissions, by requesting a paper application form from us or the Admissions Team on 0300 555 1377.

The Hampshire County Council website contains information about the application process and individual schools in Hampshire. Information on the website about the application process is also included in Hampshire County Council's brochure "A parent's guide to applying for a school place in the main admission round, School Year 2018/2019", available on request from the Admissions Team. Reference copies are also available in Hampshire libraries and schools.

It is important that you submit your application by the deadline. Late applications will not be considered until after all on-time applications which could significantly reduce your chances of gaining a place at your preferred school(s).

All online applicants will receive an e-mail confirming that their application was submitted. If you are unsure, please contact the County Admissions Team on 0300 555 1377.

Reminder - Food Allergies in School

A reminder to all parents that we do have a number of children and staff with allergies to certain foods such as cashew nuts, peanuts and shellfish. We would appreciate it if you did not send *any* nuts, nut derivatives or snack foods containing shellfish derivatives (ie prawn cocktail crisps or crab sticks) into school with your child's pack lunch/kid's club snack and, reduce to a minimum, the chance of pupils with allergies coming into contact with them.

The school acknowledges that due to food processing practices it is impractical to eliminate traces of these products entirely from an environment where there is food, but we would like to reduce the risk of cross-contamination as much as is possible.

Please discourage your child from sharing his or her lunch or snacks and encourage hand washing. If you wish to bring in cakes/treats for your child's birthday please check ingredients closely and refrain from using nuts in home-made products. Your help with this issue would be most appreciated, thank-you.

Reminder - School Car Park Guidelines

We would like to remind you of our car parking guidelines:

- Please do **not** move your cars when the children walk to or from the bus. We would request that you remain stationery for just a few minutes longer to allow the children to safely make their way across the car park
- Please do not park over the marked pedestrian walk-walks in the car-park
- Post Office staff, Sparsholt Parish Council and Sparsholt residents kindly request that you do not park in Woodman Lane, especially outside the Post Office. Parking directly outside the Post Office (where the white lines are painted) impedes our school coach which then blocks the road completely. Be aware that the service bus also needs to get through each hour
- For health and safety reasons, please refrain from parking in the entrance to the car park
- If you double-park in the car-park please drop off or pick up your child/children promptly so allowing others to get away as quickly as possible
- An alternative to the car park would be to park in Woodman Close and walk up to school through the pathway at the back of the playground we recommend this option. Please be careful not to impede disabled bays in front of some of the houses in the Close
- Please note we will **not** be able to offer the field as an over-flow car park during the winter months. We will review again late into the Spring term
- Please make full use of the bus if your child has a pass
- Finally we ask you to be courteous at all times to other users of the car park

Reminder - Beat that Louse

Please can you be extra vigilant and check your children's hair often. Although lice can be seen in dry hair, the best way to check is by the combing of wet hair with a fine toothed "detector" comb and treating if necessary, every three or four days for two weeks or until you cannot see any eggs. Treatment can either be by using over the counter treatments from the chemist, or the wet comb method and using lots of hair conditioner.
