Governors.....what do they do???

Before I became a governor of Sparsholt this time last year – I had no idea what governors really did!! A year later – things have become a little clearer!

Essentially, school governors provide strategic leadership and accountability in schools. We appoint the headteacher and deputy headteacher. It's also governors who hold the ultimate responsibility for the finance, and who work together with the headteacher to make decisions about balancing resources.

Our governors work as a team and are responsible for making sure that the school provides high quality education for all pupils. One of the governing board's main roles is to help raise pupils standards of achievement.

We meet as a full team 4 times a year – and each governor has sub committee roles – either on the curriculum team or the finance and staffing team. Each sub committee meets 3 times a year – and everytime – stats are scrutinised and new targets agreed.

You may well see curriculum governors in school observing lessons, while finance governors are more likely to be analysing spreadsheets and policies!

We are lucky at Sparsholt to have a great team of governors – many of whom are parents. If you ever want to know more – we'd love to chat!

Newsflash!!!

At Novembers Full Governing Board meeting, Mrs Laver shared some statistics from the recent Inspection Data Summary Report. Across the board, Sparsholt did exceptionally well against Hampshire and National statistics.

Most notably :

- Key Stage 2 progress in writing was significantly above average and in the highest 10% nationally
- Key Stage 1 attainment in reading in 2017 was above average and in the highest 10% nationally

School Website – all school policies are here, together with regular updates on news and events

Parents Evenings – October Half Term (Nov for reception), and Spring Half Term, plus a further one in the summer term on a request basis

Pupil Reports – Individual Pupil Report sent home at the end of the summer term

VLE – Web based communications tool, currently used for homework and pupil interaction. Further use of this being explored

Texts – School reception will send text reminders about news and events

Headteacher Meetings/ Information Meetings – all parents are invited to attend these throughout the year

Class Meetings – all parents are invited to attend at the beginning of the year to meet the teachers and understand key focus for the year

FOSS Facebook – Foss uses this to report on events and activities and ask for help. If you are not on, and would like to be, please contact Bonnie Stagg

Outcomes – Throughout the year, you will be invited to school to see the work that your child has been doing in the classroom setting Meetings with Teachers or Headteachers - Meetings can be arranged on a one to one basis if you have a specific concern that needs to be discussed. These should be booked through the school office.

Finance Update

Many of you will have read articles about the precarious financial position of primary and secondary local authority run schools. For the past 18 months, there has been a lot of media focus placed on the new way schools such as Sparsholt will be funded specifically through what is known as the National Funding Formula (NFF).

Following two rounds of national consultation, implementation has been further delayed until 2018 but the latest round still suggests that Sparsholt will receive between £5k and £10k less than we have previously.

This reduction in funding, together with increasing costs from things such as the Apprentice Levy and very modest salary increases for our deserving staff means that this year more than previous ones, we'll be very tight on our budget. We haven't thankfully yet got to the stage of asking parents and guardians to bring in lavatory paper and stationery, but we've had to make savings.

The position would have been worse had it not been for a number of extremely generous donations from the parents of current and former pupils, as well as FOSS and the Church.

As the Chair of the Finance and Staffing Committee, I wanted to personally thank those donors. We are all facing stretched household finances, but if anyone else would like to discuss the possibility of making a donation at any point in time, regardless of how small, please do get in touch.
