Increase in School Meal Price from 1st April 2017

At the Decision Day on 18 January 2017, Executive Lead Member for Children's Services, Councillor Keith Mans, approved the increase of the school meal price to £2.15 with effective from 1st April 2017.

All lunch invoices sent out at the end of the Spring term will, therefore contain amount owed up to and including 31^{st} March 2017 at £2.10 plus any lunches taken during the w/c 3^{rd} April 2017 at the new price of £2.15.

We have been informed by our suppliers that they are increasing school uniform prices from March this year. We will therefore, be increasing some of our uniform prices to reflect this increase from 1st April 2017.
