This academic year, the Chairman of Hampshire County Council has chosen to celebrate a year of music (CYOM), and is running a Schools Award Scheme to recognise the music that is taking place in all schools across the county. On a halftermly basis, activities are logged and certificates awarded based on the number and variety of musical activities offered.

We are delighted to have received various certificates for the Autumn Term, in both the KS1 and KS2 categories. KS1 has reached the 10 school-centric milestone level and KS2 has reached the 50 milestone level. This reflects the high number of our children who are involved in musical clubs, for example, choir, recorders, band, musical tuition. Well done to all involved and especially to Mrs Leitzell who continues to inspire music across the school. We look forward to receiving our next set of awards as the year progresses!
