Worship This Week- Act of Remembrance

Rev'd Jax helped us to think about Remembrance in worship this week. She explained why people wear poppies in November, as the eleventh hour of the eleventh day of the eleventh month draws near. She told us that the poppy is a symbol of remembrance, peace and hope and shows we have not forgotten what happened a long time ago. Rev'd Jax explained how special silence is and how powerful silence is for remembering and reflecting in our busy world.

The whole school took part in an Act of Remembrance in worship today, in honour of past and present service men and women who lost their lives for us to have better ones. We commemorated the 100-year anniversary of the end of World War One as each one of us placed a poppy, as a symbol of peace and hope around our worship candles. We observed a minute silence after Oak Class recited the poem, 'In Flanders Fields' and we listened to The Last Post.
