#### Whole School Home Learning Challenge - Summer Holiday Journal

We would like every child in the school to create a Summer Holiday Journal. Children can write about their highlights, take photographs, draw pictures, collect leaflets and tickets. Their journal can be presented in a variety of ways and is a great opportunity to record fabulous fables and magical memories of summer 2019. Class teachers will give each child in their class an opportunity to share their journal in the first two weeks of the autumn term.

### Social Enterprise Micro-Tyco Challenge Success!

Oak Class have excelled in their month long Micro-Tyco enterprise challenge! After lessons in learning fundamental business principles, the teams put them into practice using their £1 seed funds to create an impressive £436. All money created by our Micro-Tycos is invested by the WildHearts Foundation in micro-loans for poor entrepreneurs in the developing world. In this way participants became entrepreneurs to fund entrepreneurs in developing countries. Our pupils learn that business excellence can be a force for social good. A £250 micro-loan will help an average of 21 people a year to break the cycle of poverty; Oak class have created the possibility of helping 40 people a year with the amount they have raised. Their enterprises ranged from running a football shoot-out event, a shoe shine stall with polish donated by Russell & Bromley, table top sales selling fudge, stationery, second hand books, beeswax wraps and toys as well as a cake sale. Pupils of Oak Class reflected on the Micro-Tyco Challenge, highlights included: generating ideas, understanding more about what it takes to run an enterprise, the importance of teamwork and the concept of social enterprise. Well done Oak Class - you should all feel extremely proud! Watch this space- Micro Tyco will be run again in the next school year - can't wait!
