## Dear Parents and Carers,

This morning we had the most wonderful treat during our outdoor Celebration Worship when four of our children performed in front of the whole school. Hannah, Olivia, Madsy and Bea all played their brass instruments accompanied by their music teacher, Mr Potter. It was amazing to see the confidence and proficiency they all showed. Mr Potter talked to the children about playing brass instruments and demonstrated how different instruments sounded including the trumpet and P-bone (a plastic version of a trombone). If your child is interested in learning to play a brass instrument this September, please contact the office as we have some spaces remaining.

Safety has been a focus this week with our Junior Road safety officers giving a presentation to each class reminding them about the Green Cross Code and the real importance of always being safe and being seen when near roads. Oak class joined a virtual road safety conference with 18 other schools across the County. They learned about pedestrian and cyclist safety amongst other things. The children very much enjoyed the virtual quizzes which were not only informative but very enjoyable especially as they were competing against the other schools. Every child in KS2 has gone home with an entry form for the 'Walk to School Week' competition to design a new look for the 'Walk to School Week' materials. Please do encourage them to take part. KS1 children can also take part - our Junior Road Safety Officers will be in Beech and Willow Class to tell them all about it next week.


## Core Christian Value Awards
