Dear Parents and Carers,

It's been another amazing week with the children astounding us with their kindness, understanding and empathy to others. In Worship and in classes, the children have been discussing bullying. They have been learning about what bullying is and what they need to do if they feel they are being bullied or see others being bullied, including talking to a trusted adult. It was really pleasing when a parent feedback that whilst at the park, one of our younger children had come over and she overheard them very excitedly telling other parents all about what they had been learning and how important it was to always be kind.

## Beat that Louse

We have recently had a few cases of head lice reported. Please can you be extra vigilant over the weekend and check your children's hair. Although lice can be seen in dry hair, the best way to check is by the combing of wet hair with a fine toothed "detector" comb and treating if necessary, every three or four days for two weeks or until you cannot see any eggs. Treatment can either be by using over the counter treatments from the chemist, or the wet comb method and using lots of hair conditioner. Thank-you.

## Threadworm

We have had a couple of cases of threadworm reported to us recently. They are very common and easily treated but also very contagious. Please check the NHS website. [Please click here to access the page on Threadworm](#). As this advice tells us, simple hygiene steps are the needed to keep this at bay and it is not a reason for pupils to stay off school. The most common sign is scratching around the bottom, particularly at night. This may be associated with disturbed sleep and irritability. The threadworms may be seen in the stools and around the bottom. Some children show no symptoms at all. There is no reason to keep a child off school as long as the child is treated and the general hygiene measures are followed. Effective treatment is available from the pharmacist. It is important to treat the whole family if one person develops symptoms.

## Covid Symptoms

Can we please ask parents to continue to be really vigilant for the signs of Covid. If your child or a family member are exhibiting symptoms of Covid please (as per Government guidance) arrange to have a PCR test. Whilst close contacts who are under 18 or anyone who is double vaccinated no longer need to self-isolate, it is important that we remain vigilant to protect all members of our school community.
