## School Meal Prices from September - Information from HCC

Following the Executive Member for Children's Services Decision Day on 8th May 2019, it has been agreed that the price for a two course, hot school meal will rise by 4.3% in **September 2019**, from £2.30 to £2.40. The revised charge reflects inflationary pressures associated with food costs and staff pay which rose by 6.4% in April 2019, when the hourly pay rate for catering assistants was increased nationally. Over 90% of the cost of a school meal covers food and staff costs, with related overheads accounting for the remainder. Supplying school meals at cost, keeps the price as low as possible for Hampshire residents and ensures they receive value for money.
