Extra! Write up the  
instructions of the  
game so that others  
will know how to play.

Samuel Pepys kept a  
diary of events during The  
Great Fire of London. Keep  
your own diary for a week-  
end and write about all the  
things you do.  
Extra! Draw pictures/print  
pictures too.

Get together with  
everyone in your  
household and create a  
fire escape plan.  
Don't forget to check  
that the fire alarms  
work!

Extra! Extra! Draw a  
map of your fire  
escape route.

Visit the monument  
in Pudding Lane, Lon-  
don. Can you tell the  
class what you found  
out?

Create a poster  
showing how to  
stay safe if  
there is a fire.

Visit the local bakery and buy  
something. Can you work out  
what money you need to buy  
the item? Can you work out how  
much change you would get?

Extra! Role-play or draw a  
bakery shop with prices.

Choose a piece of the puzzle as your home learning and either bring your  
completed work into school or email photographs to the school office.  
When you have finished one of the activities, colour in that piece of the  
jigsaw to show you have done it. It is up to you how many you do and which  
one you do first.
