

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

Revd Jax Class Visits Celebrating Light and Rebirth -The Shortest Day



Reverend Jax has visited our classes this term. In Willow Class she shared Susan Cooper's joyful and beautifully illustrated picture book ` The Shortest Day'. The children were captivated as Revd Jax shared the poignant tale of how early people would gather for the long night ahead - pushing against the darkness, bringing their own light of candles and fire, dance and song. Despite the people depicted in the story wondering if the sun would ever rise again and desperate to push away the darkness, the overriding message of the tale is one of hope, love and spiritual happiness. Revd Jax led a discussion about the joy of God's wonderful creation and the gift of Jesus as the light of the world.





Standing Together in Unity Holocaust Memorial Service

At the end of January the whole school commemorated Holocaust Memorial day 2020.Led by Revd Jax and attended by Mrs Wesley (our foundation governor), who assisted Revd Jax during the service, both ensured we shared a moving service together. The pupil Worship Team told the story of Anne Frank using drama to inspire courage and determination. The whole school sang the Hebrew song 'Shalom', showing reverence and compassion as they laid their peace wreaths and peace pebbles around 75 candles. The message of the moving and memorable service was about living together in peace and accepting differences. It was a special opportunity for our school worshipping community to reflect and think together for a better future for every child and person in our world.







Ash Wednesday Service 2020

On the 26th February Revd Jax led a very special and reflective Ash Wednesday Service for children and staff in St Stephen's Church. Revd Jax asked the children to explain why Ash Wednesday is important to Christians. After readings, prayers, and a thought-provoking sermon, Revd Jax invited the children and staff to be 'ashed'. This was an opportunity to be blessed and was a reminder of the forgiveness we have been given.

Revd Jax helped us to think about the meaning of the ash, and what we might want to say sorry for - whether it was something we had done wrong, or something we had not done. A cross was marked on our forehead in ashes from last year's Palm Sunday Crosses, signifying the beginning of Lent. All the children were very thoughtful and respectful; it was really peaceful and wonderful opportunity to think and reflect, not just about the Christian Calendar, but also our actions and how we treat each other.

During the service we sang one of our favourite hymns.

LORD,THE LIGHT OF YOUR LOVE is shining; Jesus, Light of the world Shine upon us, set us free by the truth You now bring us, Shine on me, shine on me.





Year 6 shared their prayer with us as we started our journey through Lent:

World Religion Islam

Earlier in the term, a volunteer who visits schools and community groups, Hamza Berat, kindly visited Rowan and Oak Class. He talked to us about his life as a Muslim by describing The Five Pillars of Islam - the rules Muslims live by. The five pillars are: declaring your faith in God, prayer, charity, fasting during Ramadan and going on a pilgrimage to Mecca. We told Hamza that we could recognise the similarities between how Muslims try to live by the 5 Pillars and how Christians try to live in the light of the 10 Commandments.

Pupil Led Collective Worship Report -Easter Food Symbolism

This Collective Worship was led by the Joy Worship Team. We talked about the symbolism of hot cross buns, Simnel cake and Easter eggs and how they relate to the Easter story. We explained that the Simnel cake traditionally has 11 marzipan balls, each ball represent Jesus' disciples, but one of them– Judas Iscariot– is not represented as he betrayed Jesus.

We explained how the cross on the hot cross bun reminds us of Jesus dying on the cross. Next we explained that Easter eggs represent the stone that was put across the doorway to Jesus' tomb. The idea is that breaking the egg symbolises the tomb being 'cracked' open and Jesus coming back to life. We encouraged a discussion about the idea that eggs are also a symbol of hope and new life because chicks hatch from eggs and at Easter, and this reminds us that Jesus came back to life and gave hope to the world. We led everyone in prayer:





Dear God,

Collective Worship Team in Action... The Easter Story Reflection

Our Pupil–led Collective Worship aimed to encourage the children to reflect on the real meaning of Easter. We used drama to enact the moment the stone was rolled across the entrance to Jesus' burial cave. The second scene showed Mary ,arriving at the tomb early the next morning to anoint Jesus' body and discovering he had disappeared. We tried to portray Mary's sadness and bereavement turning to fear, shock and horror as she, heart-broken and sobbing, wandered in the garden until a gardener asked her why she was crying. Suddenly, Mary realised the gardener she was actually talking to was Jesus! Mary was desperate to share her news with the disciples. Confused, Peter ran to the tomb to discover for himself that Jesus' body had disappeared but the, neatly folded, cloths he was wrapped in were still there. The next scene showed all the disciples trying to make sense of what had happened when Jesus appeared to comfort his friends! He had risen from the dead and was in a different body now.

We reflected on how surprised the disciples must have been that Jesus was alive again and that we call this ' the resurrection'. Christians believe that that Jesus died on the cross and then came back to life. On Good Friday, they remember his death and on Easter Sunday, they celebrate his resurrection. We explained that Jesus didn't die again, but went back to heaven alive, which means that he is always there for us to talk to, anytime. We concluded our Collective Worship by praying together.

Dear God

Thank you that Jesus came back to life and is alive today.

Thank you that you promise always to be near us.

Help us to remember that we can talk to you at any time of the day or night.
