# Have your say on the future of Hampshire Library services

Hampshire County Council is asking people who live, work or study in Hampshire to have their say on proposed changes to libraries.

The way people use library services is changing. Hampshire Library Service continues to evolve in response. As well as responding to changing needs, the library service is looking to make savings of £1.76 million. All areas of work across the County Council are being looked at, to find savings needed to bridge the current funding gap faced by local authorities across the country, as demands for council services grow.

The proposals set out in the consultation impact all Hampshire libraries. There are two options:

- Reduce opening hours of all Hampshire libraries by 25%; or
- Close up to 10 libraries and reduce opening hours of all remaining libraries by an average of 15%

Children and young people are welcome to take part in the consultation. Organisations, including schools, may also take part.
