Dig deep and complete your jigsaw with courage, compassion and creativity.

The Great Fire of London was thought to have started in a bakery in Pudding Lane. Have a go at baking something at home. Take a picture of the final product to show us!

Paint or collage a picture using 'hot' or 'cold' colours.

(Hot: red, yellow, orange.
Cold: blue, green, purple)

Extra! Write the recipe up for someone else.

Create a board game with a Great Fire of London theme. Extra! Extra! Write up the instructions of the game so that others will know how to play.

Samuel Pepys kept a diary of the events during The Great Fire of London. Keep your own diary for a weekend and write about all the things you do.
Extra! Draw pictures/print pictures too.

Get together with everyone in your household and create a fire escape plan. Check the smoke alarms as part of your homework and get your parents to contact the local fire service if you need an alarm fitting.

Extra! Extra! Draw a map of your fire escape route

Visit the monument in Pudding Lane. Can you tell the class what you found out?

Create a poster showing how to stay safe if there is a fire, or with facts about the Great Fire.

Visit the local bakery and buy something. Can you work out what money you need to buy the item? Can you work out how much change you would get?

Extra! Role-play or draw a bakery shop with prices.
Extra! Extra! Write out word problems that a friend could answer

Choose a piece of the puzzle as your home learning and record what you have completed by uploading pictures onto the VLE.

When you have finished one of the activities, colour in that piece of the jigsaw to show you have done it. It is up to you how many you do and which one you do first.
